



Marina of Eden Island

Be sure to visit the local market, where you can stock up on fresh produce for your meals on board, or the Clock Tower, an emblem of the British colonial pa





DAY 2: MAHÉ BEAU VALLON



Located in the north-west of Mahé, Beau Vallon beach is the island's longest and most popular beach.

It's the ideal place to relax with the family or try your hand at all kinds of water activities. Bordered by avenues of palms and other trees, Beau Vallon is one of the most beautiful beaches in the Seychelles. Imagine a long ribbon of white sand, a shallow translucent sea and breathtaking seabed, particularly suited to snorkelling...





DAY 3: PRASLIN

Anse Lazio is one of the most famous and beautiful beaches on the island of Praslin in the Seychelles.

With its immaculate white sand, crystal-clear waters and picturesque setting surrounded by granite rocks, this beach offers an unforgettable paradise experience.

It's ideal for swimming, snorkelling and simply relaxing in the sun. Anse Lazio embodies the unspoilt natural beauty of the Seychelles and is a must for visitors to the archipelago.




DAY 4: CURIEUSE ISLAND - ANSE VOLBERT




Then head to Curieuse Island, another nature reserve where you can discover even more giant tortoises and the fascinating mangrove forest that covers part of the island.


Then head to Anse Volbert beach, where you can enjoy the white sand and crystal-clear waters while sampling a Creole meal in one of the restaurants set right on the beach.


La Digue, the third-largest island in the Seychelles, is a true gem. Head to this island where time seems to stand still and explore it by bike or on foot.

Must-visit sites include:

La Source d'Argent: This fascinating beach offers a unique backdrop with its gigantic granite boulders.

L'Union Estate: This historic estate provides insight into the island's colonial past, with its traditional Creole house and vanilla plantation.

DAY 6: ST ANNE



After exploring the treasures of Praslin, it's time to set sail for Sainte-Anne Marine National Park, a natural wonder located just a short distance from Mahé.


The translucent waters of this park abound in exceptional marine diversity, offering diving and snorkelling enthusiasts an unforgettable experience.



DAY 1: EDEN ISLAND MARINA




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




DAY 2: MAHÉ

Anse Royale



Anse Royale is a picturesque bay on the south coast of the main island of Mahé in the Seychelles. This magnificent bay is renowned for its crystal-clear waters, white sandy beaches and lush green hills in the background.





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DAY 4: FELICITE



This small island near La Digue is surrounded by beautiful seabed and magnificent coral. You can admire hawksbill turtles, leopard rays, blue damselfish...





DAY 5: COCO ISLAND 4°32'26-55°87'46



Off the coast of Félicité Island, you are at the heart of one of the most beautiful diving spots in the Seychelles, a little corner of paradise where you won't have to swim far to find yourself immersed in a real life-size aquarium.

Cocos is one of the few islands in the region to have preserved its wild and unspoilt appearance. This superb islet is a marvel of dream beaches, translucent turquoise lagoons and beautifully coloured seabeds.




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Then head to Anse Volbert beach, where you can enjoy the white sand and crystal-clear waters while sampling a Creole meal in one of the restaurants set right on the beach..

DAY 7: ARIDE




This small island is a nature park and is the most northerly of the Seychelles' granite islands.

It floats on the ocean like an unspoilt paradise. Aride is the sanctuary of Seychelles' biodiversity.

It is home to one of the largest bird populations in the Indian Ocean, including many endemic species. Anchoring is only possible during the day and is PROHIBITED AT NIGHT. The reef offers an exceptional diving spot.





DAY 8: SILHOUETTE

4°28'80-55°15'40



It is the main landing point for Silhouette Island. Pointe Varreur, extended by a rocky outcrop resembling an islet with a cross, is protected from south-easterly winds by two parallel groynes.


Mooring is on hard sand. Space in the harbour is very limited and you can only shelter there by OBTAINING PERMISSION FROM THE HARBOUR MASTER. The area is calm.

DAY 9: MAHÉ ANSE MAJOR 4°37'21-55°23'05




This region is classified as a nature park. Anse Major is a real postcard, with its superb white sandy beach and turquoise waters. Anchoring is recommended in SE winds.

Just next door you'll find Anse Jasmin, made up of three small beaches, each as magnificent as the next. The seabed is superb. Two superb anchorages, which accept very few boats.






DAY 10: BAIE TERNAY 4°38'14-55°22'41



This bay offers a magnificent anchorage, with its splendid seabed and superb white sandy beach. The anchorage is safe in a S.E. wind.

The bay is part of the Morne Seychellois nature park and ANCHOR MOORING IS FORBIDDEN. You must moor to one of the three buoys owned by the Marine Park. NIGHT MOORING IS FORBIDDEN WITHIN 600m of the main beach.

DAY 11: ILE THÉRÈSE 4°40'10-55°24'35




This island is bordered by one of the most beautiful wild beaches on Mahé. Boats can anchor near the pass in 8 to 9 metres of water, in crystal-clear waters. The site is ideal for diving.






DAY 12: ST ANNE



Sainte Anne Marine Park is just a few minutes from our Eden Island base. It is the ideal anchorage for your last night in the Seychelles.

It is the oldest marine reserve in the Seychelles, named for its largest island Sainte Anne. The park is made up of several islands. There is Ile Moyenne, Ile Ronde, Long Island, Ile Cerf and Ile Cachée, offering you several anchorages (for a fee) and an exceptional diving area. It's possible to find a sheltered anchorage in almost any weather.
